:Dignity

The nurse provides the nursing service, being aware of the self-respect and intrinsic values of each patient or beneficiary, and the dignity The human being is a basic value that must be promoted and protected when practicing the profession of nursing and midwifery and providing care.

The health risks of auditors who are unable to protect their interests. The nurse must respect the beneficiary based on his identity An individual who belongs to this community, regardless of the type of health problem, economic situation, and personal characteristics The other for the patient or visitor, taking into account the following:

1-The importance of the role of patients and beneficiaries in participating in health care and the way in which this is done must be recognized Providing health care Since the patient or beneficiary is a member of the health care team, it is necessary to involve him in determining a plan The health care that will be provided to him by providing facts upon which the patient/beneficiary can rely to help in

Make the appropriate decision by following the following..

a. It is necessary to know what the patient prefers among a range of health care alternatives.

B. The limits of the law and the limits of practicing the profession must be respected.

2. The boundaries of the professional relationship must be maintained between the nurse and the patient/or beneficiary. That is, it must The relationship with the patient or beneficiary should focus on the health services he needs through:

a. Early identification of all the care he needs by conducting an assessment.

B. Setting priorities for these assessed needs.

C. Applying the principle of appropriate alternatives in the event that it is impossible to obtain the necessary facilities to provide Planned services.

3-Nursing service must be provided without engaging in any harmful behavior, that is, the patient's humanity must be respected or The beneficiary through the following:

a. Respect the gender, age, and personal, religious and other beliefs that you hold.

B. Taking into account the patient's personal needs and culture when planning and implementing health care.

C. Try to control yourself and not show any emotion that might cause harm to the patient or the beneficiary.

4. Provide nursing care, taking into account the emphasis on preventive aspects and alleviating suffering at all times. any Emphasis must be placed on strengthening the patient's ability to care for himself in order to achieve recovery in the event of illness and to prevent Diseases in the state of health through the following:

a. Health education for the patient and his family to adhere to healthy habits and avoid bad habits.

B. Ensuring the patient's overall comfort, regardless of nationality, sect, gender, age, etc....

C. Supporting the patient even in the late stages to achieve a peaceful death and helping the patient's family.
