

## Reduction Risk:

The nurse puts an end to every situation, behavior, or environment that could affect the safety of patients or clients in order to protect them.

The process of reducing the risk includes the following:

**1.** You must work with the team to provide an environment conducive to safe and ethical therapeutic practice. The security Reassurance is one of the most important components of a healthy environment, and a health institution that lacks security stays away from it Health is the most precious thing a person has, so the nurse must do the following:

- a .** Not to perform any nursing skill that he is not proficient in and not to accept authorization from others unless he is proficient.
- b.** It must be ensured that there is no danger to any patient from other patients or their families.
- c.** Do not assign the patient's family to insert needles or change fluids (nutrients, etc.) on behalf of the Nurse.
- d.** Do not assign or delegate to others without knowing the level of their cognitive competencies and personal skills.

**2-** In the event that circumstances exist that prevent the provision of advanced nursing care, the nurse must inform the person Officials officially That is, with an official letter to address these situations, and to ensure this, he must follow the following:

- a .** Continuously evaluating the patient's unit and the surrounding conditions.
- b.** Evaluating the available medical tools and devices and directing their continuous maintenance to avoid their sudden stoppage.
- c.** Evaluating medical materials, monitoring their expiration date, and working to provide them on an ongoing basis.

**3- Providing nursing care in emergency cases inside or outside the workplace:**

The professional and humanitarian duty requires the nurse to carry out health care tasks immediately after any emergency occurs.

To save people's lives and reduce the danger through the following:

- a. Assessing the emergency injury situation and making the appropriate decision.
- b. Asking for help from others if needed.
- c. Call the doctor immediately or transfer the injured person to the nearest health institution when the injury occurs outside the workplace.

**4- When the nurse is an administrator, one of his duties is to care for patients, clients, his colleagues, and the community, as well as**

The institution in which he works with his colleagues, and this is achieved through:

- a. Daily assessment of the workplace and the condition of patients, their families and those accompanying them, as well as the team who he takes care of them.
- b. Removing all obstacles that prevent the provision of optimal nursing Using available administrative powers care to patients or clients.
- c. Ensuring work satisfaction and satisfaction among health team Creators and punishing those who are members through rewards negligent and who harm the profession and its professionals.
